### ROUTINE HIV TESTING



The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends one-time routine HIV testing for everyone **AGE 13-64**; **1X A YEAR** for those with HIV risk factors.

### REFER TO CARE



Patients newly diagnosed with HIV should be counseled about HIV and referred to care and treatment, including care coordination and **PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORTS**.

### SUPPORT PREVENTION
